Ultimately, we humans are so limited that it is only by a Supernatural gift from the creator that we can have faith in Him.

The Church teaches: 'God is the supreme being who alone exists of himself and is infinite in all perfection.'

*With God there is no sexuality, so God is not He or She in our sense. But most humans tend to refer to Him at 'He' rather than 'The Creator' or 'I am'.
